Charter Schools

- Free, public school
- Governed by an independent school board
- Separate from all local school systems, including Wake County
- Chartered directly by the state and bound by some state regulations but not others
- Funding sources
 - Per pupil from state and counties
 - Do not receive capital funds






Our Unique Mission

- An intellectual community of students who love to learn inside and outside of the classroom






The Basics

- Shorter day: 9:00 a.m. to 2:40 p.m.
- Classes: Students take six 45-minute, year-long classes (August through June)
- Homework: five days per week, 20 to 30 minutes per course per night (AP courses 30 to 45 minutes) = 2-3 hours per night for 9th graders; more when taking AP classes
- Calendar: School starts August 12 and mid-year exams are held in December



Finding the Right Fit

- <u>Raleigh Charter High School</u> curriculum guide
- Math 1 (Algebra 1) or higher in Grade 9 - Four high-school math courses:
 Minimum load is Math 1, Math 2, Math 3, and Math 4.
- Only Honors courses in Science, English, and History
- Two consecutive years of a second language (German, Spanish, French)
- Ninth-Grade Courses
 - Four core courses: Math, English, World History, and Biology
 - **Two electives**: World Language, Fine Arts, Health, or another core course



Admissions Lottery

- We use a software vendor to hold a random admissions lottery. Families apply through a short online application. Preference in the lottery is given only to siblings of current students and alumni, and to children of full-time faculty and staff.
- Lottery will be on Monday, March 21
 - Over the past few years, rising 9th graders have had a 7-11% chance of being admitted in our lottery due to the large number of applications.
 - Students applying for 9th grade will be admitted through their math classes. <u>More information about math pools.</u>
 - Rising Sophomores, Juniors, Seniors will be placed on waiting lists.



Application Process

- Application Window, January 13 February 28
 - A link to the online application can be found on the main page of our website (www.raleighcharterhs.org).
 - Application must be submitted online by 11:59 p.m. on February 28.
 - It takes about 10 minutes to complete an application.
 - After you submit your application, you will receive an **email confirmation**.
 - Families with limited or no internet access may visit the school office during business hours to complete an application.





Lottery Results

- Results will be emailed to you by the evening of March 21.
- Accepted students will receive materials via email soon after the lottery.
- You can log in to your lottery application account to view waiting list updates.
- Students who are admitted off of the waiting list will receive an email or phone call from the school.
